

Camping Gear List- Duffel Bag

This is a complete checklist of personal camping equipment that every Scout needs for a 1-2 night car-camping trip (not backpacking). The Patrol Quartermaster tubs will have all cooking gear.

Eating Gear

- Water bottle (preferably a Nalgene)
- Small plastic bowl
- Knife, fork and spoon set or Spork
- Waterproof matches or matches in waterproof container

Sleeping Gear

- Mummy sleeping bag (+20°) (down or synthetic insulation)
- Waterproof stuff bag for sleeping bag
- Sleeping pad (closed cell type or inflatable)
- Tent (shared with one other scout)
- Ground cloth (plastic tarp)

Clothing (Note: Items worn are included in this list.)

- Hiking boots or sturdy shoes (water proof is best)
- 2 pairs of wool socks (at least 80% wool)
- Waterproof, breathable lightweight nylon zip jacket with hood
- Waterproof, breathable lightweight nylon pants
- 2 pairs nylon hiking shorts with built-in liners or synthetic underwear
- 1 Class B Scout wicking t-shirt (wear this)
- 1 extra wicking t-shirt (Under-Armor or similar)
- 1 long sleeve wicking T-shirt (Under-Armor or similar)
- 1 pair long underwear bottoms if temps go below 60 degrees (Under-Armor or similar)
- 1 lightweight fleece jacket or vest if temps go below 60 degrees; no cotton hoodie sweatshirts, cotton = deathcloth
- 1 heavy fleece or down jacket (for cool weather)
- 1 fleece pants (for cold weather)
- 1 wool or fleece watch cap
- 1 pair wool or synthetic gloves
- Swim trunks- as needed per trip
- Cap/hat for sun protection

- Bandana

Personal Items

- Small towel (synthetic material)
- Soap (biodegradable)
- Wipes or hand sanitizer lotion
- Toothbrush, toothpaste and other personal toiletries
- Medication and instructions
- Toilet paper
- Personal first aid kit with band aids and moleskin
- Chap stick and sunscreen
- Insect repellent (non-aerosol)
- Headlamp Flashlight with spare batteries and bulb
- Extra boot laces
- Large safety pins (4)
- Needle and thread or sewing kit
- Personal identification

Miscellaneous Personal Equipment

- Backpack- depends on the trip (external or internal frame)
- Day pack
- Pack cover (keeps pack dry in rain)
- Hammock
- Compass
- Zip-lock bags (Various sizes are useful. Clothes and other items should be packed in them to be waterproof and organized. They may also be used to pack trash while on camping trips. Several spares are handy.)
- Plastic trash bags (2)
- $\frac{1}{4}$ inch diameter nylon cord (30 feet)
- Pocket knife (Totin' Chip required. Locking blade required. NO sheath knives.) (Swiss Army®)
- Boy Scout Handbook with zip-lock bag for rain protection
- Folding camp chair- optional
- Small bungee cords- optional
- Camp shoes (for use at campsite)
- Duct tape (small amount)
- Playing cards (per patrol)
- Trekking poles- optional for backpacking trips
