Campers Gear List



Pack in clear plastic bins: Two 15" x 12" x 22.5" are perfect for holding camp gear and keeping items dry for the week.

Suggested Items to Pack

- Camp Chair (Something easily transportable)
- Masks (Scouts must have multiple masks)
- BSA Class A Uniform (No Neckerchief)
- GT58 Blue Class B T-Shirt
- Scout Handbook
- Day Pack / Book Bag
- Flashlight/Headlight w/extra batteries
- Sweater or Jacket
- Rain Gear
- Long Sleeved Shirt
- Long Pants
- Shorts
- T-Shirts
- Underwear
- Socks and Extra Socks
- One piece Swimsuit
- Bath Towels
- Toiletries
- Sleeping Bag (40 degree) & pillow (pillow is optional)
- 2 Water Bottles (An extra in case one is lost)
- Comfortable Walking Shoes/Boots/Sneakers
- Shower Sandals
- Sunscreen & Bug Repellant
- Watch
- Pens/Pencils/Paper
- Printed copies of Merit Badge Worksheets

Optional Items to Pack

- Book of Faith
- Hat
- Camera
- Sewing Kit
- Fishing Gear (Lake Allen is stocked with trout, scouts have the opportunity to fish)
- Hiking Boots

No Open-Toed Shoes

Label all articles of clothing and personal gear with scout's name and "Troop 58"

Miscellaneous Information

Tents are not necessary for summer camp. All scouts will be in Platform Tents or in Cabins/Adirondacks.

Cold Mountain Outfitters is camp's one stop shop for T-shirts, hats, and other souvenirs. The average Scout spends \$80 - \$85 in the trading post. There is also a snack shop where scouts can purchase slushies, ice cream and other snacks for a very low modest cost. **NOTE: Adult Leaders and the camp are not responsible for money or lost money so scouts should be very aware where their money is at all times.**

When you arrive on Sunday (Departure Day), bring your labeled medicines in a plastic bag w/Scout's name on the bag. When you check-in, it will be compared with information we have and verified against your health forms that you already turned in

Scouts are also encouraged to bring any fun items such as footballs, chess set, cards, etc...

Snacks & Care Package

For the protection of all scouts at camp..... Snacks being sent to camp **MUST NOT** contain peanuts! Snacks should also be packaged to withstand moisture and deter critter theft. Some ideas for snacks include Goldfish, Crackers, Dried fruit, Granola Bars.

You are encouraged to send a Care Package to your scout mid-week. The Care Package can contain items such as snacks, favorite toy, magazine, book, or a simple letter from home. Sending a Care Package is completely optional, but scouts receiving a package light up with excitement when receiving it. Be on the lookout for the email from the troop on where to drop the package off on the camp week Tuesday evening in Davidson. We will transport the package on Wednesday.

Scouts should not bring electronics, portable gaming devices, cell phones, etc unless required by the merit badge class

- Rain Gear

- Pen and Paper
- Compass (Optional)
- Personal First Aid Kit (which should include the following items at a minimum)
 - 5+ Band-Aids
 - 1 Tube of antiseptic cream
 - Latex Gloves
 - 2 roller bandages
 - Calamine Lotion
 - Tweezers
 - Moleskin
 - Alcohol Swabs
